



Life Group Group Discussion Guide

Living in the Confidence of Jesus' Complete Forgiveness, Hebrews 10:19-25

Big Idea of Hebrews: If you are a genuine believer, your endurance in the Christian faith will be directly connected to how clearly you see who Jesus is, what He has done for you, and what He is doing for you right now.

BIG IDEA: As we clearly see Jesus and the finality of His sacrifice for us, we can confidently enter the presence of God through the new and living way. We can fully embrace the assurance of hope secured by Jesus, through which we can support one another by remembering what He has done for us and the promise of His return.

Summary

This passage in Hebrews emphasizes the *finality* of Jesus' forgiveness and the confidence it brings. Because of His once-for-all sacrifice, believers can boldly approach God, live in assurance, and hold onto hope. The passage encourages us to draw near to God, trust in His faithfulness, and actively encourage one another in faith as we await Jesus' return.

Read Together:

'Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. '

Hebrews 10:18-25

Content Discussion Questions

1. Understanding Finality in Christ:

- What does Hebrews 10:18 mean when it says, “*Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin*”?
- How does this verse reinforce the idea that Jesus’ sacrifice is final?

2. Confidence and Assurance in Christ:

- How does the imagery of entering the Holy Place (Hebrews 10:19) help us understand the access we now have to God?
- What does it mean to have a “*true heart in full assurance of faith*” (Hebrews 10:22)?

3. Holding onto Hope:

- Hebrews 10:23 says to “*hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.*” How is God’s faithfulness a foundation for our endurance?
- What are some personal examples where remembering God’s faithfulness helped you stay strong in faith?

4. Encouraging One Another:

- Hebrews 10:24 urges us to “*consider how to stir up one another to love and good works.*” Why is it important to think about how we can encourage others rather than just doing it passively?
 - How does meeting together as believers (Hebrews 10:25) help us stay firm in our faith?
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Life Application Questions

1. Personal Reflection on Forgiveness

- Have you fully embraced the confidence, assurance, and hope that Jesus’ forgiveness brings? If not, what might be holding you back?
- How does knowing that your sins are completely forgiven impact the way you relate to God?

2. Encouraging Others in Faith

- Who in your life might be struggling to believe in God’s goodness? How can you be intentional in encouraging them?
- Can you share a time when another believer encouraged you in your faith? What did they do that made a difference?

3. Commitment to Community

- How can you be more intentional about gathering with other believers, not just on Sundays but throughout the week?
 - What is one practical step you can take this week to “consider how” you can stir up others in love and good works?
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Gospel-Motivated Answers to Life Application Questions

1. Embracing Forgiveness:

- Jesus' sacrifice *completely* removes our sin. If we struggle with guilt, it's often because we are looking at ourselves instead of looking at *Him*. Trusting in His work means resting in His promise—"*It is finished*" (John 19:30).

2. Encouraging Others:

- Because Jesus has met our deepest need, we are free to turn outward and help others. Encouragement isn't just about offering words; it's about pointing people back to the truth of who Jesus is.

3. Commitment to Community:

- We don't gather just to check a box—we gather to *remind each other of the hope we have in Christ*. As the world pulls us away from Him, community keeps us anchored in His promises.
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Closing Thought:

Jesus' finished work brings us confidence. Confidence builds assurance. Assurance gives us hope. And that hope calls us to love and encourage one another. Let's live in this confidence and help others do the same.
